From the Rector's desk....

It has been good to see almost **doubling congregations** at Tuddenham due to the doubling of the services and of course there is plenty of room for more people. The restoration of the Book of Common Prayer for Evensong seems to have been welcomed but time will tell: our new hymn books are proving popular.

The Friends of Tuddenham Church are a great support to the maintenance of the building and we shall soon host a visit from the Diocesan Officer responsible for buildings who is concerned as to the tower especially, but other areas needing attention. At the same time there seems to be a possibility that the **5 bells** might be chimed using the Ellacombe apparatus that was previously in situ, though this will require grants fund raising and some effort.

Similarly in **Cavenham** we have a visit and may be able to have those bells ringing again. Work is likely to be started on the **Herringswell** 3 bells to ensure they can be safely rung 'Full Circle'.

Assistant Curate

Kennett Valley & South Brecks Group

The beginning of a curacy (the three-year apprenticeship that a newly ordained minister in the Church of England goes through) feels a bit like skydiving into unknown territory - exciting and a bit terrifying!

Long before curates are installed in their destinations, the Bishop asks them where in Suffolk they would prefer to serve their title. He will make choices between inland or the Eastern shore, town or city, single parish or multi-parish benefice and so on. The Bishop works hard to satisfy curates' requests and expectations, factoring in things such as the needs of the Diocese and the availability of training incumbents with whom they will continue their ongoing formation. It's an important relationship; matching the expectations, personality and spirituality of the curate with that of the potential training incumbent is the Bishop's main aim.

Once a match - made in heaven or not - is agreed, the Diocese offers a home to the curate shortly before the curate's ordination as a deacon, and it is at this moment the curate lands in unknown territory.

I cannot help but wonder how the congregations the curates are about to serve feel, as they have little to no say regarding the kind of curate they will host. Nonetheless, the training incumbent, assistant priests, church wardens, lay elders, and the church attendees are called to give the curates an unconditionally warm reception.

I am truly overjoyed, humbled and relieved to say that since my gentle landing in Tuddenham, Cavenham and Herringswell I have received love, kindness and incredible support both from the people who come to Church on Sundays and from those who participate in different ways in the life of these parishes, including events around Christmas, the Harvest, Easter and the Day of Remembrance. I will always appreciate this wonderful welcome, and all aspects of life here. And I will never take for granted the generosity around my ordination. Likewise, I'll always appreciate the kind hospitality at the coffee mornings in St Andrew's Cavenham and the pleasant landscape view from the churchyard; the joyful and relaxed chit-chat with locals at the White Hart Pub, the Purple Pantry; the welcoming presence of the people who keep St Ethelbert's Herringswell church open and take pride on its wondrous stained glass; and the Coffee Mornings at the Village Hall of Tuddenham.

My reception as a curate reminds me of the unconditional love of our Saviour, Jesus Christ; I have been accepted with grace, in the same way, by the grace of God, the unmerited happens as the sun rises every day and rainfall and sun make our crops grow.

The Manor of Tuddenham St. Mary - today (and tomorrow)

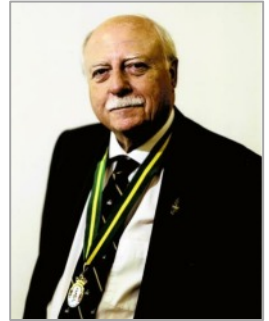
I became Lord of the Manor of Tuddenham St. Mary on 4th September, 2007. I believe that with the honour of holding this ancient title goes the obligation to make a positive contribution to the community.

Keeping up-to-date:

To make a positive contribution means keeping up-to-date with what is happening in the village.

The ways in which I try to do this include:-

- accessing the Parish Council's agendas, minutes and other publications online;
- regular communication with the Manorial Steward (Esme Murfitt);
- reading "Umbrella" magazine;
- reading the Kennet Valley & South Brecks Churches News Sheet, and contacts made over the years with local individuals and organisations.



Tuddenham St. Mary Manorial Fund:

I established the Fund in 2008 to provide financial assistance to worthwhile projects benefitting residents of Tuddenham St. Mary, and as a practical way of demonstrating my support for the village. Since inauguration the Fund has made donations totalling £10,522 through grants ranging from £100 to £1,872.

The organisations and projects supported have included:-

- Tuddenham St. Mary Parish Council = 2 public seats for the Village Green (2011) and play area refurbishment (2020)
- Tuddenham Playing Field Management Association = replacement of Pavilion windows (2016)
- Tuddenham Interest Groups Committee = "Umbrella" magazine costs (2017 & 2018)
- Tuddenham Village Hall Committee = new Village Hall project (2021)
- Miss Kim Burt = renovation of 90 Squadron War Memorial (2024) & Tuddenham First World War Memorial restoration (2025)
- Tuddenham St. Mary Bowls Club - purchase of new mower (2025)
- Tuddenham Cricket Club - new fixed net facility (2025)

The Friends of Tuddenham St. Mary's Church – I recognise that Tuddenham St. Mary's Church building is a most significant part of the village physical environment. I also appreciate that the ancient habitat of the surrounding burial ground plays an increasing role in the local ecology as a result of sensitive management. Additionally the Church is a welcoming space to celebrate and explore the Christian faith; it is a unique repository of history and remembrance; it provides a special environment for events and community activities. The 'Friends undertake the vital role of fundraising to maintain the Church and provide facilities to widen use of the building.

I support this work by being a Member of the 'Friends and also making grants from the Memorial Fund; these have contributed to:-

- repair of Churchyard boundary wall (2013)
- replacement of Churchyard boundary gates (2015)
- new soft furnishings for the Church (2018)
- renovation of old flint boundary wall (2022)

The Manorial Society of Great Britain - the Society was founded in 1906 and has a membership of about 1,900 (consisting of Lords of the Manor, Feudal Barons, Peers and historians). The Society's aims include promotion of:-

- the study of English history and traditions;
- the preservation of manorial records, and
- awareness of Manorial Lords' responsibilities in the local community

As a Member I receive information about what other Members are doing to preserve/revive local celebrations/customs/traditions and also the wide variety of initiatives they undertake to enhance community life in their areas; this is helpful to my role in Tuddenham.

Advice and information - during my 40 year career in Local Government I served with Borough, District and Town Councils in the Essex - Hertfordshire border area.

I have also been involved with many Registered Charities and other voluntary organisations serving as a volunteer, Board member and in other offices.

My professional and voluntary roles have enabled me to establish a wide range of contacts and sources of information: these have enabled me to respond positively to requests for advice/information which I receive from Tuddenham residents and organisations from time to time.

Today (and tomorrow) – Tuddenham has had Lords of the Manor for a thousand years and the office therefore provides the continuity of a living connection with the village's history. I believe that history, tradition and community are important to the wellbeing of society; being Lord of the Manor has given me the opportunity of contributing towards all three in Tuddenham - which I intend to continue in the future, as opportunities and resources allow.

News from Cavenham Heath National Nature Reserve.



Wow – it has certainly been a hot dry summer!

This has been a mixed bag for the wildlife of the heath.

Rabbits certainly seem to have done well in this weather, the Bomb field is full of them.

It is looking great and like a proper bit of hard grazed Breckland heath.

Rabbits originate from Southern Europe – Iberian Peninsula (Spain and Portugal) and they do seem to fare well in the hotter weather.

One of the earliest records of Rabbits in England is from Lynford, near Munford.

A rabbit skeleton dated at AD43 was found in an excavation of a Roman dwelling.

Archaeologists think this could have been brought by a Roman from Europe.

The main movement of rabbits is believed to have been with the Normans in the 12 Century when they were introduced as farmed animals for their meat and fur.

They were a much-prized delicacy and the food of the rich. Kings, Queens, Lords and Ladies and high officers in the Church would have dined on them or used their fur to adorn their robes. The Breckland climate and light sandy soils make it an ideal place to farm rabbits.

It became a major industry in the area with over 20 large and productive warrens documented. It is hard to imagine that landscape; it would have looked like the Bomb field on a massive scale with millions of rabbits running around on the over grazed, exposed sandy soil... treeless, windswept, wild, open heathland as far as the eye could see, all the way from Cavenham to Swaffham!

The Stone-curlew have had a reasonable year with good nesting attempts and chicks seen.

But they do seem to have given up breeding rather early. The pre migration roost started to gather in mid-July. This seems early although our records show, a similar early roost occurred in 2002. We are wondering if there just wasn't enough food available for them as the grass was scorched and brown. So this year it is likely to have been lean times for Stonies which use their big yellow eyes to spot beetles and other tasty snacks running around on the heath at night!

One plant that is normally prolific on the heath is Ragwort. This year it has done badly with hardly any seen on the reserve. Although much maligned as poisonous to farm stock, it is a fantastic plant for wildlife with over 200 species of insects and invertebrates recorded using it. The lack of Ragwort must certainly have had an impact on food availability for many bird species and overall biodiversity.
